


## JANE'S ADDICTION

The New York plastic surgeon Gerald Imber, a longtime favorite of the Park Avenue set, has performed more than 4,500 facelifts but, honestly, he'd rather just sell you a face cream. "I've been the high priest of 'less is more' forever," says Imber (above), who recently launched Youth Corridor skincare. Named for both his 1997 beauty book and his Upper East Side practice, the line includes a nourishing cream, a whipped retinoid gel, and, best of all, Youth Corridor Ultimate Antioxidant C Boost Serum (inset, \$305, net-a-porter .com). "Vitamin C is the only thing that gets into your skin and works to build collagen and rejuvenate," Imber says. "Use it for two weeks, and you'll send me a thank-you note.'

#### Gloss Over It

Some people are born with great skin. The rest of us hide our flaws as best we can-and these products make it easy (below left, clockwise, from top right). When I want a smooth finish, I reach for Kevyn Aucoin the Guardian Angel Highlighting Cream (\$52, bergdorfgoodman.com), which is loaded with carnuba wax, beeswax, and shea butter. For those who prefer a little pigment in their base-but still want to look as natural as Flower founder Drew Barrymore-there's Flower EE Erase Everything Ultimate Foundation (\$13, walmart.com). And the newest addition to my arsenal is the Estée Edit by Estée Lauder Pore Vanishing Stick (\$28, sephora.com), which can be applied either under makeup or over it, should any unforeseen disturbance threaten to mar that "perfect" complexion.

### To Bear Fruit

No one wants to smell like lemon Pledge. But when citrus is a supporting player, it gives a scent a subtle juicy twist (right, from left):

Nest Fragrances Citrine (\$68, sephora.com): Freesia and lotus are the main notes, but lemon blossom adds an underlying zestiness.

Dior J'Adore Eau Lumière (\$114, dior.com): This famed rose fragrance gets a drop of blood orange.

Gucci Guilty Eau (\$99, sephora.com): Layered upon a musky base, mandarin and orange flower have never smelled so elegant.

Diana Vreeland Vivaciously Bold (\$185, bergdorfgoodman.com): Lemon and grapefruit give beach grass-y vetiver surprising sex appeal.

Bulgari Goldea (\$155, saks.com): Bergamot cools this creamy patchouli and jasmine elixir.

Hermès Eau de Néroli Doré (\$129, usa.hermes .com): Saffron imparts an herbaceous note to the orange blossom here.

### The New Soft Shoe
